CLP Power Hosts Workshops to Engage with Community Leaders and Property Management Industry on Electricity Topics

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited (CLP Power) has engaged with community stakeholders on a range of electricity-related topics. Last month, it held 14 workshops on power quality for elected district councillors of the new term. A seminar was also arranged for property management professionals to address topics such as energy saving, decarbonisation, power quality, transport electrification, and CLP Power's community support initiatives. The workshops and seminar provided CLP Power with valuable insights into the concerns of community leaders and property management professionals on electricity topics.

Around 250 community leaders, including district officers, representatives from district offices, and district councillors were briefed about developments in the power sector in May. CLP Power shared information about its energy saving and decarbonisation promotion efforts, outlined knowledge and mitigation measures for voltage dips, and introduced a series of programmes supported by the CLP Community Energy Saving Fund. The participating community leaders responded positively and indicated that the information acquired at the workshops would help them provide appropriate support to their districts.

Separately, more than 1,500 property management professionals attended a Continuing Professional Development Seminar, in person and online, organised by CLP Power in partnership with the Property Management Services Authority and the Hong Kong Association of Property Management Companies. At the seminar, CLP Power shared the latest information on electric vehicle charging and guided participants through understanding the causes of voltage dips and their impact on building operations and facilities, as well as introducing the mitigation measures to improve the industry's capability to handle voltage dips, such as installing ride-through devices in elevators and escalators that are more sensitive to voltage dips.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, "We understand that members of the public are very concerned about power quality. We

therefore actively engage with stakeholders through a variety of activities to raise their awareness of voltage dips. We also leverage on our power expertise to provide free technical advice and support to our customers to minimise the impact on their equipment. Over the past three years, we have reached out to more than 100 housing estates and customers, and nearly half have adopted our recommended solutions for mitigating voltage dips. We also take short, medium, and long-term measures to minimise the impact of extreme weather on our power system, and to respond timely to stakeholders' expectations and needs."

In addition to the seminar, corporate customers and technical managers from the property management industry are invited to visit the CLP Power Quality Workshop, where exhibits and interactive facilities illustrate the causes of voltage dips and CLP Power offers advice on appropriate mitigation measures for different businesses. CLP Power also runs regular workshops to promote a range of energy saving and decarbonisation funding schemes to help customers improve their energy and operational efficiency.
