## CLP Pulse Invites Visitors to Discover Summer Delights for Promoting Culture and Green Living

CLP Pulse is staging a month-long programme of arts and activities called **‘Discover the Summer Delights at CLP Pulse’**, inviting residents and tourists to uncover unique stories about the historic building and its surrounding Kowloon neighbourhoods. The programme includes a series of workshops that give participants the opportunity to unleash their creativity and explore the concept of decarbonisation for a sustainable future.

More than 60,000 people have visited CLP Pulse since it opened in May 2023. The venue has blossomed into a thriving cultural and community hub, hosting a succession of experiential programmes that showcase Hong Kong’s rich heritage and support the city’s promotion of cultural tourism in recent years. For the Summer Delights programme, CLP Pulse has teamed up with local historians and artists to organise a wide range of activities from today to 7 August, including a heritage talk on the histories of Kowloon Tong and Ho Man Tin, workshops on subjects ranging from miniature art to upcycling and sustainability, and a harp performance. The diverse activities will give residents and visitors the chance to explore and appreciate the delights of culture and green living, adding a new dimension of learning and discovery to their summers.

CLP Power Chief Corporate Development Officer Ms Quince Chong said, “The CLP Clock Tower building has been transformed into a hub for the promotion of history, culture, and green education since its revitalisation. By spending just half a day in this Grade 1 historic building, visitors can fully immerse themselves in activities and exhibitions featuring local culture, history, and the concept of a sustainable future. We hope people from different backgrounds and interests will visit and strengthen their connection to the community and their sense of belonging.”

Local miniature artist Mr Tai Yau-on (On Tai), who has previously created four miniatures on the subjects of electricity and the lives of Hong Kong people for CLP Pulse, has teamed up with the venue again to design a desk lamp inspired by household environments of the 1970s. Workshops will be held for participants to handcraft their own lamps. On Tai said, “The popularity of electricity has changed

the way people live. By the time electric lights were commonly used in Hong Kong households in the 1970s, families were able to gather for quality time at night without having to rush home and sleep after sunset.” Registration forms for the workshops and the details of activities will be released in July 2024 on the CLP Pulse website ([Event | CLP Pulse](#)) and on Instagram ([@clpulsehk](#)).

The handrails at the main entrance of CLP Pulse have meanwhile been decorated with yarnbombing to make it a colourful photo spot for visitors during the Summer Programme. Visitors who complete a series of designated tasks will win keychains as souvenirs and will also be able to assemble replicate images of the CLP Clock Tower by collecting three different stamps from locations around the museum.

CLP Pulse is open every Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 10am until 6pm. Entry is free of charge and complimentary guided tours and experiential activities can also be booked online at [www.clpulse.com](http://www.clpulse.com).

CLP Pulse hosts a range of multimedia exhibitions and experiential activities and has blossomed into a thriving community and cultural hub.
